



Branka is currently a Professor in Management at the Charles Sturt University, on Bathurst campus. She obtained her Ph.D. from Lincoln University, New Zealand with the topic on exploring ethnic entrepreneurship in New Zealand in agriculture.

Branka's research interests are particularly in the areas of international migration, immigrant and refugee entrepreneurship in regional communities, as well as in the area of rural cosmopolitanism and global countryside. She worked on research project on Attracting and Retaining Immigrants in Non-metropolitan Australia which produced 'a tool box of ideas' for rural and regional communities which are trying to attract new, highly skilled immigrants and resolve a labour shortage in some professions. She also finalised (together with Professor Jock Collins from UTS) large scale projects on New Immigrants Improving Productivity in Australian Agriculture, and more recently a project on Humanitarian Immigrant Entrepreneurs in Private and Social Enterprises which made a significant theoretical contribution to the newly emerging field of refugee entrepreneurship and advanced the practice of refugee enterprise facilitation.
